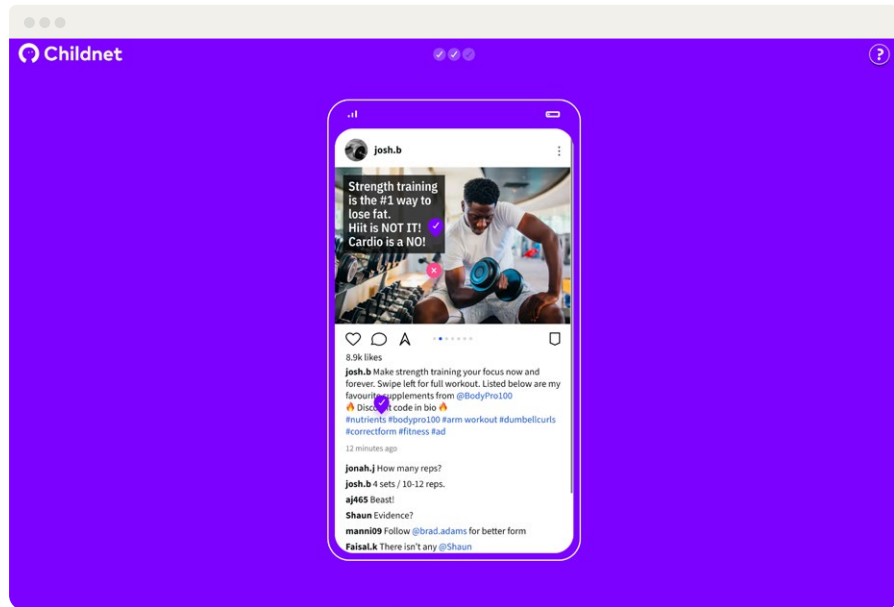
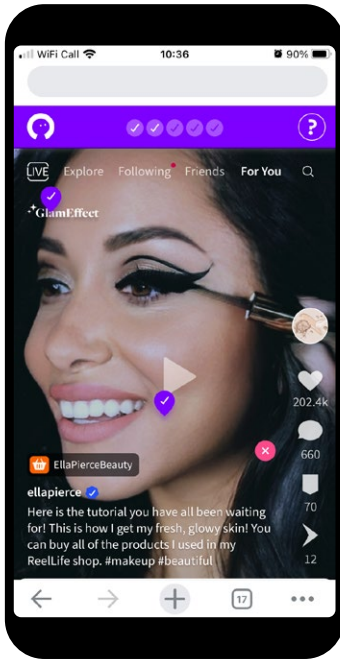


Reliability online



Suggested activities and answers

Target audience

Learners who are going online for their news and information.

The internet has transformed the way that we get our information and connect with others, but these changes have not all been positive. With the growth of AI generated content and new technologies emerging, it is becoming increasingly difficult to know what to trust and who to believe. [Reliability online](#) was developed with the Childnet Youth Advisory Board and examines the reliability of the people, information and news that young people see online.

How to use this resource

This document has been designed to support the use of the interactive resource, [Reliability online](#). There are suggested activities, printable versions of all the examples, and answers to the tasks.

Reliability online

This interactive resource teaches learners strategies and tests their understanding. There are three parts, each designed to become more challenging.



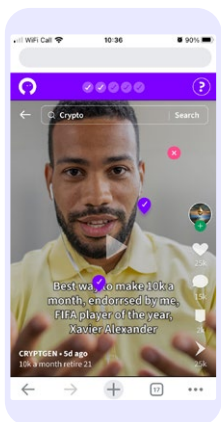
Part one – Reliable or not?

Learners look at posts and articles to decide if they can be trusted.



Part two – Can you trust the news?

Learners are asked to identify if the news stories they see are examples of bias, exaggeration or alarmism.



Part three – Spot the signs

Learners are challenged to identify and point out the different signs and risks of posts.

Suggested activities

 Individual or small groups

Write the advice

Print out a range of the posts and articles from the resource. Learners should choose one to focus on, consider what risks it contains, and write their advice. This could include top tips, steps they can take and memorable messages. The advice could then be shared with the rest of your group, or in your wider setting through displays or newsletters.

 Individual

Create your own unreliable content

Learners devise and create their own unreliable content. This should highlight some of the risks they have seen themselves or have knowledge of from using the resource. This activity can be completed either by hand or on a device. Here are some ideas of some content learners can create:

- A social media post (photos or videos)
- A fake news story
- An online scam pop-up
- A giveaway
- A social media profile
- A video of a live news event

Extension

Once each learner has created their unreliable online content, it can then be reviewed by others in their class or group. Select one example to review as a class or group, where you can model how to spot the unreliable content. After the task is introduced, sticky notes could be supplied for the learners to jot down any unreliable content they can spot in each other's creations.

Suggested activities continued

 Small groups

Rank the risk

Provide learners with paper copies of the posts and articles. Explain to the learners that the examples cover many risks and that some risks can cause more harm than others. Learners should then arrange them in the order from least risk to most risk by considering the impact it would have upon someone. Learners can then see how other groups have arranged them and discuss the differences between their rankings.

 Individual or small groups

Create your own checklist

Ask learners to create a reliability checklist to help people decide if something they see online is reliable or not. Learners could look at several examples and create one list or they may choose to focus on one of these:

- Social media posts
- Influencers
- Online news
- Buying and selling online
- Videos e.g. deepfakes, AI filters...

Suggested activities continued

 **Small groups**

AI images – can you spot them?

In small groups, provide learners with a mixture of images. The images will either be AI generated or not. Ask learners how we can tell which image is real and what advice they would give to others in this situation.

 **Whole group**

AI – have your say

In this task, learners will have an opportunity to debate the positives and negatives of using AI. The learners should be split into two groups. One group should put forward a case for all the benefits of using AI whilst the other group should debate the negatives. Learners may use their knowledge and what they have found in the resource so far or research their topic further to explore aspects like generative AI and virtual assistants. Once they have prepared, bring the two groups together to present their points. After the debate, they should decide which side had the strongest reasons. To extend this learning, they could present to another group of learners and allow them to decide which side they agree with.

High profile footballer accused of stealing charity funds to buy new car

Renowned non-league footballer accused by a local charity of stealing much needed funds.

The charity, who help hundreds of children in their area to access sports activities, believe the semi-pro footballer is withholding the money raised at a recent gala evening.

The player, who at present remains unnamed, has yet to hand over the sponsorship money he promised to raise for the charity, but has been spotted driving a new car around the local area.

The gala evening took place yesterday at Macefield Town Hall, where it is believed over £5,000 was raised through auction and donations. “Apparently he’s an ambassador for the charity and always been so supportive of the work they do for the local kids,” reported an attendee of the gala event. “He said he was going to match what they raised but nothing’s been handed over yet. It’s quite a coincidence that he’s suddenly driving around in a new car.”

The source reports that the charity has contacted the player’s management on several occasions and the case has now been handed over to the authorities.

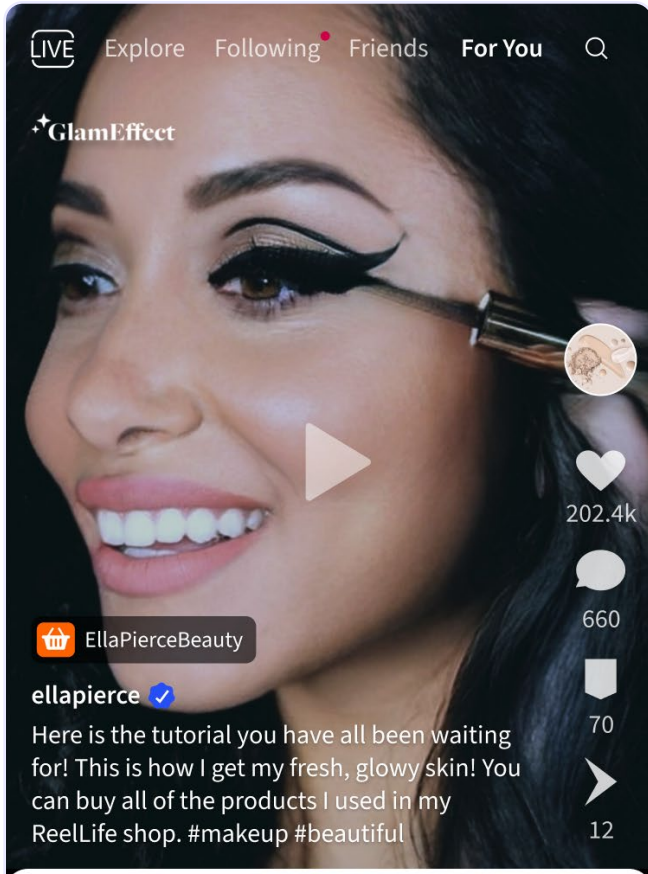

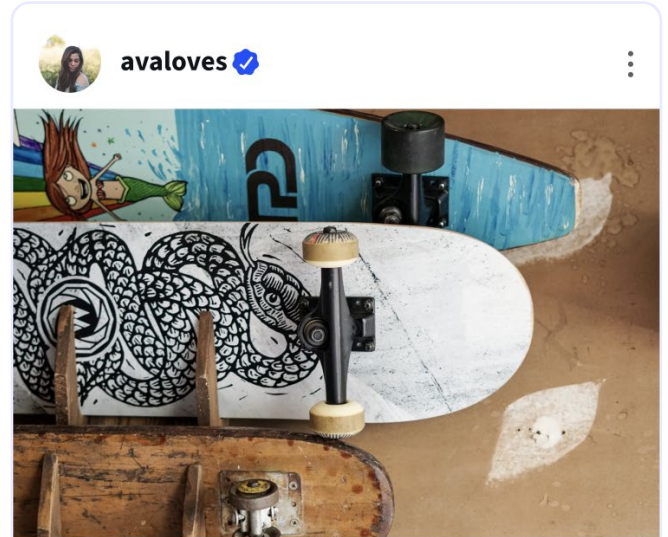

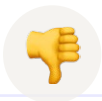

Part 1 – Reliable or not?



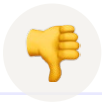
Here are the untrustworthy aspects:

Account JK43354g

The username JK43354g looks like a bot account and so do some of the accounts commenting. Social media bots are computer programmes that allow people to mimic real users and manage multiple accounts. These bot accounts can be used to spread stories, make comments, like and follow. They often have suspicious usernames and make similar comments.

The photo

The post uses #cardiff but the photo is from Germany.



Here are the untrustworthy aspects:

The photo and description don't match

This photo shows someone wearing the 'brand new trainers'. Are these the trainers that they are selling?

The comments

Buyers seem unhappy. People are asking James to reply and for a tracking number, which suggests they have not received their items.

The hashtags

Hashtags are generally used to get more views but may not be accurate. The trainers might not actually be real or cheap.

Here are the trustworthy aspects:



The photo

This is the Childnet logo.

The text in the post

This information matches what we told you about Childnet earlier.

The post was liked by Childnet

If Childnet's official account liked it, it should be trustworthy. However, it is worth checking that it is actually the official Childnet account.



Here are the untrustworthy aspects:



The photo

It is a screenshot from an old video. You might have noticed that the journalist and all the police officers are wearing face masks.

The comments from DamnShane

DamnShane appears to be a friend or acquaintance who knows that Activ1st is not even in London. They have spotted this image being shared around online even though it is old.



This is a difficult one to decide. The account could be seen as reliable or unreliable but it is a selective view of someone's life. Here are the signs:



The photos

The photos look like they have been chosen to show only the best bits of this person's life. It is not an accurate view of their whole life.

Editing

These photos look edited to change how they look.

Answers continued



Here are the trustworthy aspects:



The content is healthy and inspiring

This influencer is showcasing a healthy lifestyle by fuelling her body for a long run.

Photo

The photo matches the description and is not advertising or promoting any products.

Verified account

This is useful but we know that some social media allows people to buy verification. It is best to do some more checks.



Here are the untrustworthy aspects:



Clickbait headline and article

The news story is about a non-league player who has been accused of stealing the donation money from a fundraiser. However, the event only took place the day before the article was published and there is no solid evidence.

Unnamed sources

Neither the player, charity nor the supplier of the quote are named. They could be made up.

The photos

You can't see the person properly in the photo on the right. For the car photo, AI photo editing was used to blur the number plate, erase people in the background, and take off the shop branding.

Part 2 – Can you trust the news?

Alarmism



Here are the signs of alarmism:

The headline and quote

Both are likely to make people worry. The quote implies that something terrible has happened.

The photo

Although this is a Shortfin Mako Shark, the photo chosen does make the shark look very scary. They could have used a photo of the beach.

The article

This reveals that the surfer was not seriously hurt and the minor surgery could have been a few stitches. It also states that these attacks are incredibly rare, and this is backed up by a comment from a marine biologist.

Exaggeration



Here are the signs of exaggeration:

The headline and quote

The headline makes you think that the feud is real and has been going on for a while. Quotes should be credited to the person who said it.

The photo and social media comments

Both women are smiling and the social media conversation looks like a joke between friends. There is no evidence that the smiles are forced and not genuine.

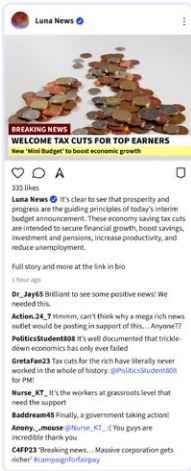
The article

The article uses exaggerated language. The fact that Linzi and Jazzlynn dressed the same is described as "agonizing," leaving the two women "mortified." It says that Jazzlynn snubbed Linzi and builds up the feud even though they happily posed for photos together.

Bias

Here are signs of bias:



The breaking news banner

The tax cuts are not introduced with neutral or objective language. They are described as "welcome" and a boost for economic growth which suggests that the news outlet is in favour of the tax cuts.

The text in the post

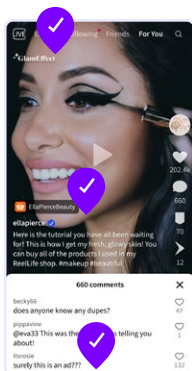
The opening line highlights the prosperity and progress that the plans are designed to bring. Luna News also uses words like save, boost, secure and increase to show that they support the mini budget.

The comments

People are challenging the post and calling out bias in the comments. One implies that Luna News will financially benefit from the plans.

Part 3 – Spot the signs



Here are the signs that this post is unreliable:

Filters and effects

Ella has used the Glam Effect AI video filter to change the way she looks.

Advertisement

Ella has advertised her own product in this post and has not disclosed this information. If a post is an advertisement, a creator should use #ad or other labelling to inform their audience.

Comments

The comments are asking Ella if the post is an ad, showing it is clear she is advertising products without disclosing this.



These people might not be reliable:

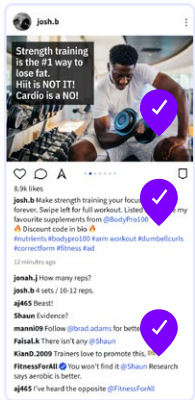
Avaloves

Ava is using this competition to get more engagement with her account. People entering the competition will drive up her followers, likes, comments and shares. Entrants are relying on avaloves to run the competition fairly.

Ava.lovess

This person is trying to impersonate avaloves and saying that j.lewis has won. It is probably a trick to get their personal information.

Here are the potential risks of believing this post:

Body image

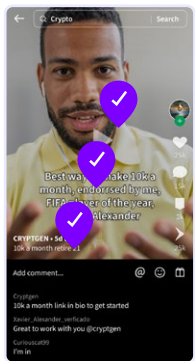
Josh is implying that anyone can look like this if they follow him and his suggested workout. As a result, viewers may feel unhappy with the way they look and under pressure to make changes.

Advertising

The post is paid advertising for a supplement which may not be safe or suitable for young people. It raises the question about the responsibility of influencers and what they endorse.

Conflicting advice

People are challenging Josh’s advice in the chat which makes it difficult to know who to trust. You’ll also see that manni09 is using this chat to promote someone else to follow. It is important to find what works best for you.



Here are the signs that AI was used to create this video post:

Missing wire

Xavier Alexander’s left headphone wire is missing. Sometimes these can be very hard to spot and you need to look really closely.

Spelling error

AI has been used to create the subtitles but there is a spelling mistake.

The wording

The caption “10k a month retire 21” does not make sense.
